Question of the Week: What are the Moveable Alphabet and Sandpaper letters?

The Moveable Alphabet is a box of individual, lowercase, wooden letters, in cursive or print. The consonants are red or pink and the vowels are blue. The Moveable Alphabet is typically used with children four through six years of age. The Moveable Alphabet use starts with single letters to small words and phrases.

The Sandpaper letters are squares with each letter of the alphabet in sandpaper in cursive or print. The purpose of the sandpaper letters is to teach children the sounds of the alphabet through muscular visual memory. Children trace the sandpaper letters with their fingers while learning the alphabet.

The Moveable Alphabet and Sandpaper letters are two key materials used to teach children how to read, write and spell.


