A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL, MR. ERIC

It seems like with the cold weather, gatherings, and celebrations, and less time with doors open and children playing outside, we have started to see an uptick in children coming down with colds, flu, and other illness. This is to be expected, but there are a few things we need to keep in mind.

Children should stay home if they have any of the following:

- Child has signs and symptoms of COVID-19 as listed on the CDC COVID Website or the HDMS COVID screener
- Child has an undiagnosed fever of 100.4 degrees or higher, vomiting or diarrhea
- Child has an undiagnosed skin rash
- Child has drainage from eyes, nose, or ears
- Child appears to be ill and is unable to participate in normal school activities
- Child needs more care than can be provided by school staff

Sometimes it is hard to know when to return to school. The general guidance is that children should not return until

- Nausea and diarrhea symptoms, as well as any fevers, have been completely gone for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medicines
- All other symptoms are improving

Exclusions for specific diagnosed conditions may be found on the Washoe County Health District Website. <u>Specific Guidelines for Childcare</u> and <u>Specific Guidelines for Schools</u>. When our numbers reach "Outbreak Status" the Washoe County Health District steps in to manage the outbreak. Exclusion periods increase during an outbreak and will be communicated to families.

Finally, if a child is returning from any respiratory illness, it is advisable that the child should wear a well-fitting mask for 5 days.


If they are not using time wisely at school, I may contact you to help give them some extra time at home.

This is a wonderful way to channel excitement and high energy at this time of year into creative projects. Many of you have already donated materials to our class and we are very grateful. Here is a list of materials students will need for their projects. Thank you for anything you can contribute. You may send it with your child or drop it of in the pickup line:

- Glue sticks for a glue gun
- Cardboard broken down all types
- Cardboard rolls (wrapping paper, paper towel)
- Baking soda (for making clay)
- Corn starch (for making clay)
- toothpicks
- Tarps (we can return if you don't mind possible paint stains)
- Parachute cord or other thin, strong cord
- metallic colored paint (silver, gold, bronze, etc.
- small boxes (such as shoe boxes) or box lids for dioramas not broken down
- poster board, various colors
- "pipe cleaners" = chenille sticks
- Markers
- Money donations to buy extra supplies as needed




