ATTENTION! NOTE REGARDING EARLY PICK UP




The number of children leaving ten to twenty minutes early each day (and especially on early release days) has become problematic and is a schoolwide safely concern. We only have one staff member working the front desk at any given time. When a student cannot be reached by calling the classroom, our front desk person must leave the front desk and try to locate the student. This leaves our front desk unmanned, which means there is no gatekeeper for our school and no one to answer phones for our school.

Unless your family has a true emergency or medical appointment, please refrain from picking your child up within the last hour of the school day. If you arrive during your child's normal staggered arrival window, things generally run very smoothly and there is very little wait time.

Thank you for your support. The safety of our students is our upmost priority.

Question of the Week: "What are Puzzle Maps and Pin Maps?"



In the Montessori classroom, children use maps to learn about continents and countries, and how countries fit together. The Puzzle Maps allow children to see, hold and trace continents, countries and states. The Pin Maps are a more abstract look at world geography. Different colored pins are used to mark water features, landmarks, cities, and capitals. The purpose of the maps is to promote sensorial and experiential learning of children. Both the puzzle maps and the pin maps have a built-in control of error.



ECO ART UPDATE

I continue to give lessons in making art with nature to some of the classrooms of Lower Elementary. These past weeks, the children made personal sculptures from clay, which I then brought to be fired in a kiln, and then the children learned to make their own glaze to paint over their sculptures. We used a mortar and pestle to grind different kinds of earth gathered in the playground, and diluted our pigment with water. In another lesson, we grinded more earth this time to mix it with vegetable oil so as to paint on wood or paper. We also experimented with burnt wood and charcoal as great tools for drawing on uneven surfaces, in the spirit of ancient cave art. Some of the children have also been inspired to make their own ephemeral creations, grounded in ecologically-conscious land art. Each lesson brings so much joy in realizing how we can create the most amazing art with simply the things we have aplenty around us.
