

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL, MR. ERIC

As you know, mother nature has been really finicky this year. We have had a ton of delayed starts, snow cancellations, and even a fire/smoke cancellation this year. We did a deep dive into our minutes as required by the State Department of Education and found that, despite all of the missed school, our Adolescent Program (7-8 grades) was the only level where we were short of the required number of minutes required by state law.

This week, the state approved our plan to make up those missing minutes. We will adjust the school day for the Adolescent Program by adding 40 minutes to the day from May 8th through June 8th. The pick up window for Adolescent students and their siblings will be from 3:40-3:50 (after Primary dismissal). Boundary Peak and Granite Peak advisory students will be picked up in Area 2/3 (please enter the parking lot at the first (EAST) driveway and wrap on either side of the solar bay). Wheeler Peak and Star Peak Advisories will be picked up in Area 4/5 (please enter the parking lot at the second (WEST) driveway and wrap on either solar bay.



Ms. Laurel, our Communications Coordinator, will email all families affected by this plan in the next few days to discuss the impact to each family. Happily, we will not have to extend the school year by using contingency days, nor will we have to cancel our much-needed professional development early release Wednesdays. We appreciate your understanding and patience with this process. Thank you for your continued support of HDMS.



The 1st-3rd grade students in the Candelaria classroom have been growing all types of veggies in the current modular greenhouse and overseeing the school composting program- thank you, Ms. Kelly and Ms. Jazmine.





Question of the Week: "Why do children misplace things?"



Children are undisputed champions at losing things-the lost and found at HDMS is evidence of that! But why does this happen?

It's natural for children to lose their stuff, especially young school-age children. At this stage of their development, children are egocentric in their thinking and live in the moment. They can be oblivious to things outside themselves, including the jacket they took off at recess.

How can you help your child stop losing things?

- Teach your child to get organized
- Set up routines
- Make a checklist
- Make searching for lost things easier
- Replacing lost things with new ones is not advised.

Helping your child keep track of things is a long process, and may be challenging; but should get easier as they get older.






