A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL, MR. ERIC



There are a lot of things happening in Carson City with the legislature these days, and one bill has charter schools, including HDMS, very concerned. SB231 is a bill that allocates \$250 million for increasing school staff salaries. This sounds really great, but the text of the bill only allows these monies to be paid to school district employees and NOT to charter school employees. An inequity in pay will make it difficult for charter schools to attract and keep quality employees.

Taken in total, charter schools in Nevada have large enough populations to be considered the third largest school district in the state. Charter schools serve public school children and it's time they receive fair and equal funding to their counterparts in school districts!

We urge you all to immediatly follow the link below and submit your opposition to the bill as written. Action is being taken this week!

Please help to get HDMS staff, as well as all other charter school employees, equal treatment as public educators for Nevada's future.



A MESSAGE FROM OUR MONTESSORI ADVISOR, MISS KALEIGH

Myths about student centered learning continued:

• Students cannot learn new material on their own. In a student centered learning environment like Montessroi, the classrooms are intentionally designed with materials and resources that allow children to learn new ideas. The teacher acts as a guide when the student is discovering new information in the classroom.



- Student centered learning is not rigorous- a student centered classroom takes a cross-curricular approach to learning. Children explore and understand content on a deeper level and are often mastering content in many areas at a time
- Allowing children to work at their own pace can cause them to fall behind- lessons and instruction are given to students at grade appropriate and student appropriate levels.

Student centered learning promotes partnership and collaboration between learners, peers and the teacher.


GREEN PARENTS GROUP




