

REGISTRATION FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR



Registering through Infinite Campus by June 9th secures your student's spot. Failure to fill out the registration could result in a loss of their seat at HDMS. We need just 5 minutes of your time to complete registration for the entire school year!

The due date for registration is June 9th. If you do not plan on having your student attend next year please let Miss Stacey know.

HDMS is returning to the Infinite Campus registration system (as opposed to Google Forms) for next school year. EVERY student at HDMS (age 3 through 8th grade) must be registered through this system.



STEP 1: Open <u>Infinite Campus</u> Log in to the Parent Portal (if you have forgotten your username or password, please call or email Miss Stacey stacey@hdmsreno.com)

STEP 2: Click "More" on the bottom left hand menu

STEP 3: Select "Online Registration" -Select "Start"

STEP 4: Select Child and "Begin Registration"

STEP 5: Complete all phases of Online Registration

STEP 6: Click on the large red "Submit" button to complete registration

Dear Toquima students and families,


